## MELBOURNE ART FAIR 22 - 25 FEB 2024

THIS IS NO FANTASY will be exhibiting the work of Ali Tahayori and Alexandra Standen. Both artists draw on ancient Islamic traditions and disciplines, reframing them in the modern world. Surface and refraction are defining features of both artists' practices. Their seductive veneers are disrupted by traces of the human hand, creating works that are alluring and enigmatic.

#### ALI TAHAYORI | ARCHIVE OF LONGING

'Archive of Longing' is a personal search for glimpses of love and belonging within an inherited family archive.

'In 2018, I inherited a series of family photographs from my mother. Even though I had seen these images as a child, I started seeing them differently. The photographic archive was significant to me personally as it revealed hidden facets of my mother's life before her marriage, but it was also meaningful collectively as it reflected aspects of Iranian social life before the 1979 revolution. Revisiting these images after thirty years, I started seeing numerous possibilities, affiliations, and connections not included in my mother's original narrative. I began to tell my story with and through them. In the process, the family photographs are enlarged, cropped, and printed on glass. The printed glass is then broken and reassembled to create sculptural reliefs.

Using glass instead of paper as a foundation to maintain and reveal the visual content references wet plate negatives in the history of photography, where in the 19th century, they were used for sharper, more stable and detailed images. Also, like Daguerreotypes, visibility shifts as the viewer moves around the image. Similar to a broken mirror, the reflective broken glass returns the viewer's gaze while looking at history and memory from a queer diasporic lens, searching for glimpses of queer intimacy and desire within a violent socio-political context. Photographs are fragments of reality, time, and place. In some ways, these works are fragments of fragments of fragments.'

#### BIO

Ali Tahayori's interdisciplinary practice ranges from conceptual photography to the moving image, and installation. Tahayori uses archival materials, narrative fragments and performative modalities to explore themes of identity, home, and belonging. Combining fractured mirrors with text and imagery, his works draw on ancient Iranian philosophies about light and mirrors to create kaleidoscopic experiences; moments of both revelation and concealment hint at the conflicted nature of his identity. Translating the traditional Iranian craft of Aine-Kari (mirrorworks) into a contemporary visual vocabulary, his practice combines a discourse about diaspora and displacement with an exploration of queerness – in both cases, poignantly testifying to his experience of being othered.

Born in Shiraz, Iran, Ali currently lives and works in Sydney, Australia (Gadigal country). Raised in the oppressively homophobic climate of 1980s Iran, Tahayori assumed the identity of an outsider, further compounded by his migration to Australia in 2007. He holds a Doctorate in Medicine and MFA in Photomedia from National Art School. Tahayori has exhibited locally and internationally and has been a finalist and winner of several local and International art prizes.













#### ALEXANDRA STANDEN | SHINY OBJECTS

Alexandra Standen celebrates the beauty of ceramics. Unlike mass-produced vessels, she elevates the imperfections of hand-made works by using quality Italian Majolica glazes and 24 karat gold.

Ceramics is one of the most ancient industries in the world, going back thousands of years, and throughout that history the chemistry of surface has been pushed to produce some of the most sought after objects of art.

Historically gold and lustreware come from the decorative technique invented by Abbasid potters of the Islamic Civilisation, in what is today Iraq, in the 9th century C.E. Well into the 12th century, potters travelled within the Islamic state developing lustre recipes. It was believed making lustreware was true alchemy as the process involved using lead-based glazes and silver and copper paint to achieve the lustrous gold affect without using any gold at all. The techniques were carefully guarded secrets and travelled with artists from their origins in Iraq to Egypt, then onto Syria and Persia, finally making its way to Europe, where houses were adorned in lustrous tiles and tables were covered in reflective vessels to impress guests. More recently, these techniques became popular in the 19th century as part of the English Aesthetic Movement, and started being used in major factory potteries like Wedgwood and Staffordshire.

'Today the recipe has been refined and the gold I use comes from Northern Ireland and does include a percentage of 24 karat gold. Throughout its history, gold lustre has been painted over Italian Majolica glaze to achieve the coveted high shine and vibrant gold surface. I wanted to follow with tradition in this body of work 'Shiny Objects', so I have used Majolica glaze as a base for the gold surface.' - Alexandra Standen, 2024

#### BIO

Alexandra Standen's work explores our relationships to both physical and emotional spaces. Her work focuses on the subjective, cultural, and ideological meanings of material objects, examining the way objects and their relationships act as metaphors for human behaviour.

Her practice also speaks to the process of making work in ceramic and a sense of unease that comes with engaging with a medium that holds a functional quality yet has a connotation of being fragile or precarious in nature. The repetitive gesture of 'pinching' her hand-built forms is as much conceptual as it is an act of realisation.

In 2019 Standen was the recipient of the prestigious Cité Internationale des Arts Residency in Paris and undertook self-guided research living in Istanbul. Winner of the Sidney Myer Award for Ceramics, Shepparton Art Museum 2012, Standen has been a finalist in awards including the Churchie National Emerging Art Prize, Gold Coast Ceramic Award and the Wynne Prize. She has undertaken residencies in Geneva, Tel Aviv and at the Harley Foundation in the United Kingdom.


